This major is also offered as a 2+2 program on the campus of Tallahassee Community College (TCC).

Completion of this program provides students with the ability to pursue a graduate degree in Social Work and become a Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW). Students can also apply directly to the TU Clinical Rehabilitation and Mental Health Counseling master's degree program.

This major prepares graduates for beginning professional social work jobs in public and private agencies as generalist social workers working with individuals, families, groups and communities. Students complete field practica, research and 12 credit hours spent in field internship.
